FROM THE DIRECTOR...

It's really hard to believe this is the end of our 40th season. It just seems like yesterday we were celebrating our 30th! I decided to share a special memory from the past in my Director Letters this season. This memory of our first *Coppélia* proves that a little effort can go a long way and that good people coming together can create something amazing that will impact many lives now and in the future.

I have always had big dreams and had a great desire to bring Classical Ballet (besides Nutcracker) to our community! Maestro Adron Ming and I put our heads together and decided to do Coppélia! So little known fact, LBT's first production of Coppélia had a live orchestra and was produced together with the Board of the Lewisville Lake Symphony! The performance was 31 years ago at Lewisville High School! I remember hearing the orchestra at our very first rehearsal with them and chills went through me! It was nothing short of glorious! First and foremost, we needed a set and had no money. We had no sets, no costumes....nothing but a vision! I DID know what I was getting into but with many wonderful people by my side, I knew we could do it! A Coppélia set not only requires two houses, one of them must be a two-story house and have a working window and door. With a very small budget, my dear husband (who has made so many of our sets and props over the years) assembled the structure and Nancy Loch and I decided we could do the painting ourselves. (It was probably more like multi-talented Nancy decided we could do the painting, and I would help!) Soon, several parents were pitching in and we had some awesome painting parties late into the night! It took several men to stand it up when we arrived at the theater (and still does!) Since we only do Coppélia every 4 or 5 years, the set you see today has held up since 1993. I never imagined the countless dancers who would dance in front of this set. And I also never imagined we would be at this 40 years later! But LBT has brought so much joy to my life that the years have truly flown by. The beautiful dancers I work with make it special and different each season, and I am so proud to see the lessons they learn and the amazing hard working people they become as adults! I am grateful that LBT provides a much needed outlet for our community dancers to practice the skills they work so hard at each day and to express themselves as artists.

I cannot wait to see our Alumni who are attending this weekend and know that the current dancers of LBT and LBT2 are proud to continue the tradition that you continued. They are excited to dance for you this weekend and also a little nervous. LBT alumni have big pointe shoes to fill!

A very special thank you to Steven Loch for adding the icing to the cake for this 40th anniversary celebration! Steven is the perfect Franz in Coppélia and this is one of his favorite roles! He loves to come home and perform with us as much as we love having him guest with us. Thank you for making special arrangements to be away from Miami for our 40th. I know it was not easy but you literally grew up in front of our very eyes as a member of LBT and LBT2 and it would not be the same without you here to celebrate with us!



The History of LakeCities Ballet Theatre

The evolution of LakeCities Ballet Theatre, a not-for-profit organization, has had many significant milestones during the past 39 years. First chartered as the Lewisville Dance Ensemble in 1984, the company's purpose was to provide a performing outlet for local dancers and dance students. During the 1989-90 season, charter member Kelly Kilburn Lannin assumed the position of Artistic Director and dedicated herself to taking the company to a professional level that would, in turn, bring recognition to the community through the arts. To celebrate the growth of the organization from a small ensemble to a ballet company, the company name was changed to LakeCities Ballet Theatre and now encompasses dancers and audiences from Lewisville, Flower Mound, Highland Village, Lake Dallas, Denton, Coppell, and the surrounding areas. In 1991, LakeCities Ballet Theatre introduced its first major production of The Nutcracker, choreographed by Mrs. Lannin, and supported by an enthusiastic Board of Directors dedicated to bringing this new production to the stage. LBT's production of The Nutcracker was guickly recognized as a star in the local arts community by the Greater Lewisville Arts Alliance and the City of Lewisville. In 1992, Mrs. Lannin collaborated with Maestro Adron Ming to incorporate the Lewisville Lake Symphony, making LBT's production the first regional company in the metroplex to boast a live, professional orchestra! Mrs. Lannin was also instrumental in bringing world-class guest artists to Lewisville. Before long, this small company, made primarily of student dancers, began to attract favorable notice from not only area dance critics, but also from international guest artists such as Damian Woetzel, Wendy Whelan, Jennifer Ringer, Daniel Ulbricht and Miranda Weese from New York City Ballet, and Julie Kent, José Manuel Carreño, Paloma Herrera, Marcelo Gomes, Sascha Radetsky, and Sarah Lane from American Ballet Theatre. Soon to follow were other performances by the company including The Sleeping Beauty, A Soldier's Tale, Cinderella, Coppélia, Giselle, Swan Lake, Peter and the Wolf, and beginning in 2006 an original production of Le Ballet de Dracula. Mrs. Lannin also encouraged the Board of Directors to bring master teachers and guest choreographers to enhance the training of LBT dancers. LBT dancers have gone on to dance professionally and to receive major accolades and awards because of the training and performing experience they received as members of LakeCities Ballet Theatre. The company has grown in both reputation and stature in the North Texas area and continues to develop today due to the commitment of our dancers and parents, the devotion of our Artistic Staff, the hard work of our Board of Directors, the support of both our Guild and the City of Lewisville, and the persistence and vision of our Artistic Director, Kelly Kilburn Lannin.

The History of LakeCities Ballet Theatre 2

In 2002, LBT2 was formed as a younger branch of LakeCities Ballet Theatre for the sole purpose of extending the same wonderful performance and training opportunities to a younger, serious group of dancers. The success of LBT2's formative years is attributed to its founding Director and LBT Alumna, Lindsay Coe, who set a high standard for these younger artists. Shanon Tate took over as Director in 2007 and was instrumental in maintaining the cohesiveness and high artistic standards during the past fifteen years. The tradition of excellence in preparing younger ballet students to excel in the art continues this year with Mrs. Sarah Solomon Rosenzweig. Dance education and performance opportunities are abundant in LBT2 as the company performs in LakeCities Ballet Theatre's three largest productions each season including Dracula, The Nutcracker and in their annual spring concert. LBT2 also competes in the Youth America Grand Prix competition and at local events, such The City of Lewisville's Western Days and in Dallas' Dance Planet Festivals. In 2004, 2009, 2012 and 2020 LBT2 was invited to perform in the International Finals of the Youth America Grand Prix competition and in 2010 and 2019 helped LBT receive the third-place ensemble award also at the Youth America Grand Prix competition. LBT2 continually strives to enhance our dancers' education while inspiring their passion and artistry. LBT2 is very proud to begin their 21st season with a renewed passion and strength led by Ms. Rose!

Kelly Kilburn Lannin is celebrating her fortieth season with LakeCities Ballet Theatre! Originally from El Paso, Texas, Lannin received her classical training at Ballet El Paso from Director, Ingeborg Heuser. In 1983, she earned her bachelor's degree in dance from Texas Woman's University in Denton, Texas performing with Dance Repertory Theater, DRT Touring Ensemble, and other area companies. In 1984, she married Ken Lannin and moved to Lewisville. At that time, Lannin began her association with the LakeCities Ballet Theatre as a charter member, dancer, choreographer and teacher and was so excited to share her passion, knowledge,

and experience with her new community. In 1989, she assumed the position of Artistic Director and her dedication, high standards and artistic integrity have allowed the company to emerge as one of the leading regional companies in the Metroplex. She successfully choreographed Lewisville's very own production of The Nutcracker, as well as directed LBT productions of The Sleeping Beauty, Giselle, Coppélia, Cinderella and others, Lannin has created over 50 original works for LBT to include Dracula and Carmina Burana, as well as ballets in collaboration with the Lewisville Lake Symphony including Peter and the Wolf, A Soldier's Tale, Creation of the World and A Night in Old Vienna. Her choreography of Lacrimosa performed by Steven Loch, was selected to be performed at the Youth America Grand Prix "Stars of Today Meet Stars of Tomorrow" Gala and the Miami International Ballet Festival. In 1990, Lannin founded the Ballet Conservatory along with Mary Neel and the school has become a highly respected institution noted for training and grooming dancers who are regularly accepted to prestigious ballet schools and universities in the United States, Canada and Europe. Lannin was commended in 1998 by the Honorable Bobby Mitchell for her dedication to the Arts Community, recognized by the Greater Lewisville Arts Alliance with an "Angel Award" (1994) and was the first recipient of their "Community Angel Award" (2002). She also received the LakeCities Ballet Theatre Lifetime Guild Membership award for the 2021-2022 Season. She has been honored four times with the "Outstanding Teacher Award" by the Youth America Grand Prix organization, and is beyond proud to have five former students currently dancing with professional companies. Mrs. Lannin is an honorary board member of the Lewisville Lake Symphony, and completed a three-year term on the board of the Dance Council of North Texas. She was honored to serve on the dance panel of Texas Commission on the Arts. Mrs. Lannin is most grateful for her supportive husband of 40 years, their wonderful daughter, Kendall, and new son-inlaw, Kevin, who has already been roped into the LBT family!

Coppélia A Ballet in Three Acts World Premiere 1870 in Paris

ACT I - The curtain rises on the square of a small European town several hundred years ago. The town is celebrating a new town bell that is due to arrive. Anyone who marries on that day will be awarded a special dowry. Swanilda is engaged to Franz, and they plan to marry during the Festival of the Bell. However, Franz seems to be paying more attention to a girl named Coppélia who sits reading in the window of Doctor Coppélius' house. Franz hides as Doctor Coppélius comes out to adjust the doll's mechanism, which he sets in motion. Coppélia stands up and blows kisses in the direction of Franz, who is unaware that these kisses are not really for him. Swanilda, entering at this moment, is dismayed by these kisses and dashes angrily away, only to return chasing butterflies and is assisted by Franz, who manages to crush the butterfly he has caught. Swanilda ridicules him and at the same time indicates her strong displeasure at his attention to Coppélia. Swanilda asks Franz if he loves her and he answers yes, but she doesn't feel it is heartfelt. The Burgomeister enters to announce the Festival of the Bell celebration. Asked if she will marry Franz, the pouting Swanilda puts a sheaf of wheat to her ear. According to old custom, the wheat will rattle if her love is faithful. Sadly, the wheat is silent. The other couples, however, are delighted at the Burgomeister's good news and dance until night falls.

When the village is quiet, Doctor Coppélius comes out, locks his door, and is immediately swirled away by a boisterous band of revelers. In the excitement, he drops the key to his house. Swanilda and her friends appear, find the key, and enter the house filled with curiosity about the strange Doctor and Coppélia. Doctor Coppélius returns, sees his door open and darts in. Franz enters carrying a ladder which he uses to climb to Coppélia's window with plans of his own to meet the mysterious Coppélia.

ACT II - THE DECEPTION

Inside Doctor Coppélius' house, the girls are investigating the puzzling contents of the workshop. Discovering Coppélia, they realize she is only one of several dolls—all quite human in appearance—which the girls uncover and set in motion. Doctor Coppélius comes upon the scene and furious, he sends the girls scurrying in fear from the house. Swanilda, unable to escape with the others, hides in a closet with Coppélia, where she changes clothes with the doll and assumes her identity. Franz, ignorant of all these events, enters searching for Coppélia. Hiding until Franz is inside, Doctor Coppélius catches him after a frantic chase and questions his motives for being in the house.

Doctor Coppélius conceives a plan: He will give Franz a sleeping potion, after which he will extract the "life force" from his body and use it to breathe real life into his most beloved doll, Coppélia. He entices Franz to drink the potion, disguised as wine, and Franz soon falls into a deep sleep. While Franz is unconscious, Doctor Coppélius brings out Swanilda, who he believes is his doll, Coppélia. Through his maneuvers, Doctor Coppélius "succeeds" in eliciting from Swanilda a series of doll-like movements which he naturally attributes to his "magic"! Unsatisfied by her stilted movements, he mixes a very special potion designed to instill more realistic and human qualities in the doll. He sprinkles her with this mixture, whereupon she suddenly becomes guite genuinely alive for him. Overcome with joy at his success, Doctor Coppélius has the "living" Coppélia entertain him by dancing. Tiring of the game she is playing. Swanilda tries to awaken the unconscious Franz, and Doctor Coppélius catches her, pushes her back into the closet and sits down to catch his breath. Once more, Swanilda renews her escape attempt, knocking over all the dolls in the room and creating general mayhem and confusion in the workshop. Doctor Coppélius is still unaware that he is dealing with Swanilda and not with Coppélia. At this point, she discloses her true identity as Swanilda, and at the same time revealing the Coppélia doll sitting in disarray in the closet. Franz finally awakens and overhears Swanilda as she explains to Doctor Coppélius how she has changed places with the doll. Franz realizes he has become infatuated with nothing more than a doll and knows now that it is Swanilda whom he has truly loved all along. Thereupon, he rescues Swanilda from the confusion and disarray of the house of the now-broken-hearted Doctor Coppélius.

ACT III - THE WEDDING

The curtain rises on the final act where the villagers are happily preparing the square for the Festival of the Bell and also the wedding celebration of Swanilda and Franz. An irate Doctor Coppélius arrives to denounce the wedding because of the havoc the young couple created in his life, but he is calmed by the Burgomeister and given a bag of gold to cover the damages and a place of honor at the festivities. Several dances are presented to represent the importance of the new bell and the reasons why it rings. First, "Dawn" dances to represent the coming of each new day. "Prayer" dances to remind the people that the bell rings at vespers calling them to prayer. Other duties of the bell are depicted in scenes representing "Work" and to announce "The Golden Hour and Setting Sun." The beautiful "Waltz of the Hours" is the final dedication of the bell featuring 12 dancers representing each hour of the day in their symbolic circle of pirouettes. "Peace" descends on the land with the Wedding Pas de Deux of Swanilda and Franz. The village rejoices, and everyone dances late into the evening!
